Deadline approaching for 2010 Golden Apple Awards
for Excellence in Teaching Nominations
December 31 is the last day for submissions

CHICAGO (December 18, 2009) – There's still time to nominate an outstanding teacher for the 2010 Golden Apple Golden Apple Awards for Excellence in Teaching, but not much, as the submission deadline of December 31, 2009 is fast approaching.

Administrators, teachers, counselors, parents and students are invited to nominate outstanding teachers currently teaching full-time in grades 9 through 12 at a public or non-public school in Cook, DuPage, Kane, Lake and Will counties.

The brainchild of Golden Apple founder Martin J. (Mike) Koldyke, the Golden Apple Awards for Excellence in Teaching aim to recognize and honor outstanding teachers for their contributions to building a stronger, better-educated society.

Every year since 1986, Golden Apple has chosen 10 outstanding teachers to receive this prestigious award. These teachers become lifetime members of the Golden Apple Academy of Educators, which conceives, develops and supports programs for teachers to make them more effective in the classroom.

Winners receive a paid sabbatical to study tuition-free at Northwestern University, a \$3,000 cash award, recognition on a WTTW/11 one-hour television program, and induction into the esteemed Golden Apple Academy of Educators.

More than 500 Chicago-area teachers have already been nominated. Applications will be reviewed in early 2010, with 30 finalists announced on March 25, and the 10 winners announced on May 13. The winners will be honored at the 25th Anniversary awards presentation in October.
