At this point we will break into small groups. I recommend beginning your day with a LIGHT lunch in the basement food court at Water Tower Place (800 N. Michigan Ave). You and your group will have the afternoon to navigate your way through the streets of downtown Chicago in search of the "perfect photo" of various historically significant landmarks. Teams will be judged based upon the number of sites they are able to visit, the quality and originality of their photographs, depth of information gathered/researched/reported, etc. Use space within this brochure to note any special information about the places you visit. Once your group has accomplished its scavenger hunt goals and completed a journal chronicling your activities that includes submissions from *all* group members, you are free to take advantage of downtown cultural, educational, and/or shopping experiences at your leisure, but never on your own. Journal Work: Harold Washington Library—400 S. State St.

4:30-5:30 p.m.

You will have an hour to work with your teammates to compile the most outstanding group journal in AP history. Be sure to include a summary description and/or historical background information about each site visited. There are work tables that you can use on the fourth floor of the library. The bus will pick us up promptly at 5:45 on the northwest corner of Wabash and Jackson. It is important to be on time as the bus cannot park here.
